In closing I again wish everyone a happy holiday and thanks for all your support.

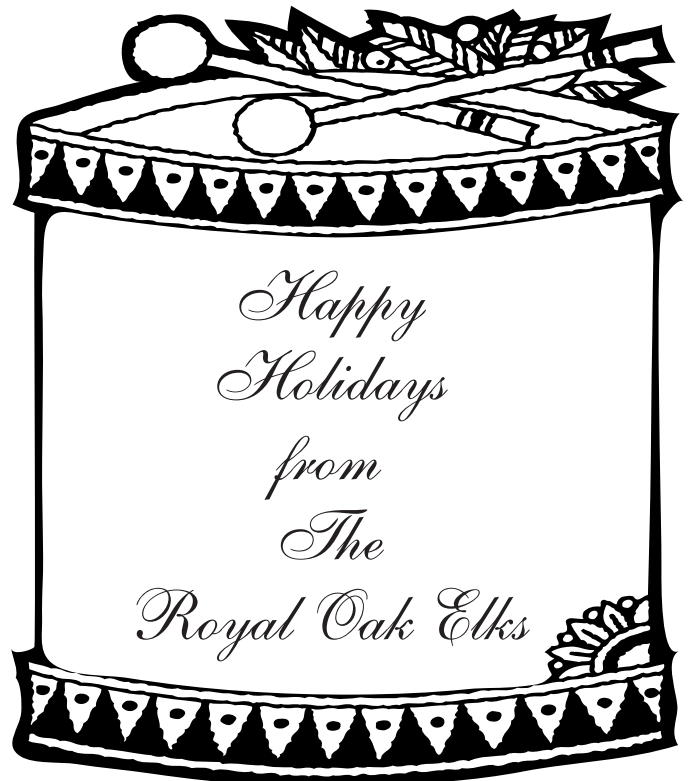

From the Club Manager

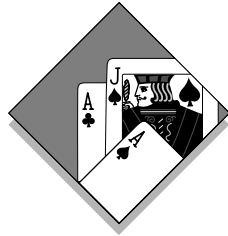
Hi Everyone,
