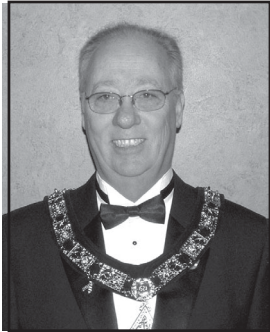

From the Club Manager

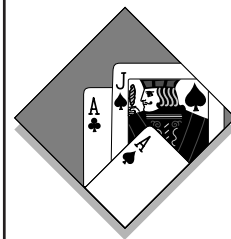

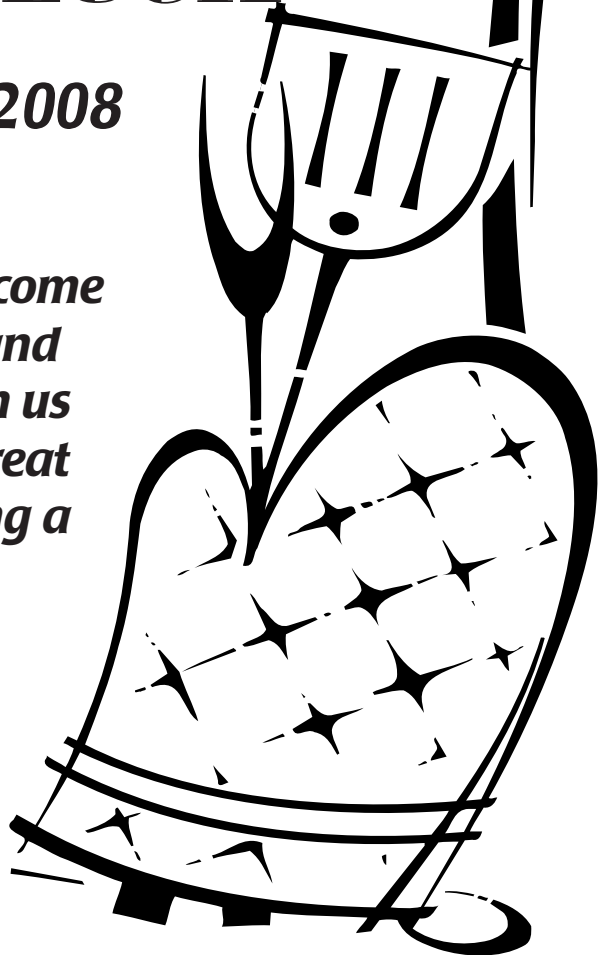

Golf Report

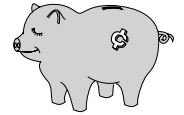
