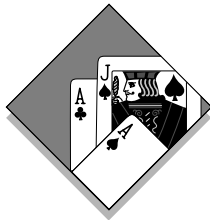
**From the Club Manager**

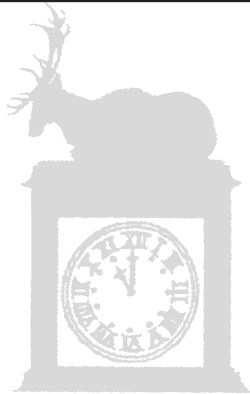

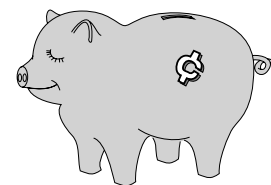
