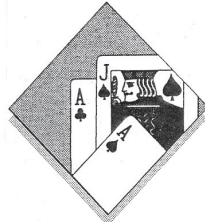

BIG CHIEF FRIDAY NIGHT

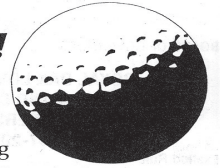

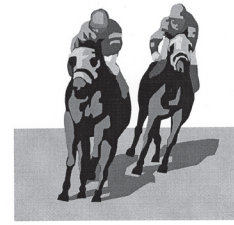
